





Introduction

This report details just some of the fundraising activity and support shown for Cardiff & Vale Health Charity since the start of the COVID-19 Pandemic in March 2020. The limitless generosity and dedication to raise money and support Cardiff & Vale Health Charity's 'Spread the Love' Campaign is truly inspiring. We have received donations from generous businesses, organisations and members of the public, all to support our NHS staff, patients and volunteers affected by COVID-19.

Due to the volume of support received, this report is just a snap shot in time of the many and varied ways we have received not only donations, but also gifts in kind, food and toiletries and enables Cardiff & Vale Health Charity and Cardiff and Vale University Health Board to say a huge thank you to these generous donors and incredible fundraisers who have done so much to support patients and staff during these unprecedented times.

This also highlights some other donations received since March 2020 including those from Gareth Bale, Aaron Ramsey and Sir Stanley Thomas which were not only incredibly generous, but put the spotlight on Cardiff & Vale Health Charity and promoted the work we were all doing to support our patients and colleagues.

As an NHS Health Charity, we have also benefitted from monies raised nationally through the NHS Charities Together campaign, which reached national news due to the money raised by Sir Captain Tom Moore and others. We have highlighted some of the ways, in which we have started to spend and allocate this money across the Health Board for the benefit of patients, staff and our communities. Aimee, a local NHS staff member working in a GP surgery in Barry, also has her own business designing wedding stationery. Aimee had the ingenuity to design herself a rainbow t-shirt and posted a picture of it on her personal Facebook page, expecting just a few friends and family members to buy one.

Each t-shirt sold was raising £5 for charity to be shared equally between Cardiff & Vale Health Charity and NHS Charities Together. Aimee sold more than 400 t-shirts to people not only in Barry, but also further afield in Manchester and Birmingham.



Allensbank Allotment

Allensbank Allotment have been growing and selling plants to plot holders, all in aid of helping staff across Cardiff and Vale UHB during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Allensbank Allotment, which the University Hospital of Wales overlooks wished to help our NHS heroes during this difficult time. The committee members of the allotment decided to grow vegetable plants for plot holders to purchase with the proceeds being donated to the 'Spread the Love' campaign.

Amber wanted to provide good quality moisturiser, face wipes, lip balm and hand cream for care packages for Nurses, Doctors, Health Care Support Workers and Physiotherapists who have to constantly wear masks and goggles. Mum Karen, a Physiotherapy Technician, also helped to deliver over forty packs to share with colleagues working on COVID and Intensive Treatment Unit wards.

Volunteers from across Cardiff and the Vale coordinated the collection and delivery of goodies for NHS staff across the UHB, particularly; West Quay Medical Centre, Barry Community Midwife Team, Barry Community Mental Health Team, Broad Street Clinic, Barry, University Hospital Llandough and University Hospital of Wales sites.

The group delivered 2 rounds of 'CARE-ONA' boxes, the first round was completed mid-March. They also help residents across the Vale with shopping, prescription pick-ups and posting letters.

Once complete, the runners were encouraged to challenge 5 others to also undertake the challenge. The campaign also gave the added benefits of keeping people fit and healthy as well as protecting their own mental health during the lockdown.



Betsy Bodman Toy Sale

A big thank you to Betsy Bodman who kindly had a clear out of her toys and decided to have a toy sale outside her house to raise money for the NHS. She delivered flyers to all the houses in the street and surrounding streets.



Breathe Music Live Stream DJ Sets

Breathe Music hosted and live streamed DJ Sets throughout a day during lockdown to spread positivity through music and raise money for frontline NHS staff in Cardiff and the Vale. Breathe Music instigated many to dance their way into the night as a result of their music and generosity.



Cardiff Bus Dress Down Days

Cardiff Bus held a number of dress down days to raise money for Cardiff & Vale Health Charity. All were encouraged to wear bright clothes, Hawaiian shirts or fancy dress to help bring a smile to faces across Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan.

Chris was inspired by his mother-in-law Bev, who underwent life changing surgery for a "rare and aggressive" cancer in 2016. With a full recovery, Bev worked as a full time Nurse Specialist in the Neurosurgery team of Cardiff and Vale UHB during the pandemic, caring for patients affected by COVID-19. Chris and Mark both wanted to show their support for Bev and the rest of our NHS heroes by shaving their heads and fundraising for Cardiff & Vale Health Charity.

Chris, who is a Consultant Speech and Language Therapist, also hosted a virtual coffee morning. The coffee morning provided parents with an opportunity to discuss their child's speech, language and communication needs via Zoom, where every consultation was completely free, instead asking people to kindly donate £5 to Cardiff & Vale Health Charity.

Christine Kerr's Knit a Rainbow

Christine is part of the vulnerable to COVID-19 group due to her underlying health conditions so had to self-isolate. Despite being in isolation, Christine wanted to show her support for the NHS so decided to start fundraising. Christine decided that she would knit a rainbow from Dingle Park in Penarth all the way to the University Hospital Llandough, a total length of 1.5 miles, completing the challenge on 9th September 2020.

'Eseta Tpa'atoutai-Uhi's 2.6 Challenge



The Principality Stadium in Cardiff was transformed into Ysbyty Calon y Ddraig, the Dragon's Heart Hospital, during the pandemic to help ease pressure on NHS services. Dan produced a series of illustrations featuring staff on the frontline – and sold prints, donating 50% of the profits to Cardiff & Vale Health Charity's Arts Fund.



Dave Hobbs and Rhiwbina Rugby Football Club

The local rugby club located near the University Hospital of Wales raised money for Cardiff & Vale Health Charity, with the team being very keen that purchased items would be of benefit to both our staff and patients. Through their fabulous fundraising they were able to purchase 41 DAB digital radios and 5 Echo Dots.





Emily Chirighin's 177 Mile Challenge

Inspired by other NHS fundraising heroes Captain Tom Moore and Geriant Thomas, 17 year old Emily also wanted to show her support for our NHS. A student currently studying for her A Levels at Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Glantaf, Emily decided to start fundraising in aid of all the NHS staff during this pandemic. As a way of showing her thanks, Emily decided to challenge herself during the lockdown to cycle the equivalent distance between Ysbyty Gwynedd in Bangor and our very own University Hospital of Wales in Cardiff, a total distance of 177 miles within 7 days.

Emily completed her challenge, nearly cycling the equivalent of a marathon each day.

Dance teacher, Gareth has been sharing weekly live Workout classes to help keep people motivated, during self-isolation. Asking for a contribution for a class, Gareth raised money for his local NHS and did brilliantly.

With the picture receiving many positive reviews online, Lisa suggested it would be a great opportunity to raise money for the NHS via Cardiff & Vale Health Charity. The fundraising pair decided to share a re-edited version of the image, encouraging people to make a donation in return for downloading and printing the picture for free.

Inspired by the sacrifices made by both NHS staff members and the public alike, Mark decided to shave off his mighty impressive beard in order to raise funds for frontline staff during the pandemic.





Michael Owen's 300 Mile Challenge Supporting Intensive Care Unit

Peter Owen was admitted to the COVID-19 Intensive Care Unit at the University Hospital of Wales. To show his gratitude for the care his father was receiving during this truly difficult time, Peter's son Michael decided to start fundraising and set up a JustGiving page to support the dedicated staff of the Intensive Care Unit.

Michael, along with 24 other family members and friends pledged to complete a challenge that between them, they would walk, run and cycle the distance from Cardiff to Aberystwyth pier, a place close to Peter's heart, three times. The group of 25 fundraisers collectively completed this mammoth challenge over Saturday 16th May and Sunday 17th May, exceeding the original goal of 300 miles, actually achieving a distance of 687 miles.



Millie Catherall Neighbourhood Fundraising

Millie aged 8, helped by her Mum Jayne, has been bringing her neighbours together during the pandemic with a series of activities and events. As well as doing the weekly shopping for some of the older members of their street, the pair have organised a VE day celebration, a Bake Off competition with 23 entries and have been holding regular street get-togethers to help with social isolation and also selling books and toys to raise money for Cardiff & Vale Health Charity.



Rachel Hannah



River Island Cardiff Branches Unite to Fundraise for NHS





Upon being discharged from the hospital and returning home, Stephen had to shield for a further six weeks due to the medication he was prescribed. Following the completion of his treatment course and as a result, his shielding period, Stephen decided to set himself a challenge and fundraise for Cardiff & Vale Health Charity in appreciation of the care he received in hospital.

As a former athlete and current coach, Stephen wanted to return to his previous fitness levels challenging himself to run the Cardiff Half Marathon route on Saturday 4th July whilst obeying social distancing guidelines. As a patient, Stephen understands that it can get lonely in hospital due to the visitor restrictions currently in place. As a result of this, he wished to support the Patient Experience Team via Cardiff & Vale Health Charity, who are helping brighten up patients' days by providing them with items such as toiletries and day and nightwear clothing.


Tessa Marshall In Memory of Jitendra Rathod

Tracy Carwardine's Brave the Grey Challenge




