

We have thoroughly enjoyed welcoming weekly performances from the musical talents of The Welsh National Opera and the musicians of Harmoni Cymru. With its continuing success there was festive joy on the wards in December with "Christmas Concerts" from both!! Patients loved the Christmas singalong and joined in with their old favourites accompanied by games of Musical Bingo and an artificial snowball fight to finish! It was wonderful to see how quickly the patients adapted to the live Zoom performances hosted weekly.

With patients having to remain on their wards and at their bedside we have continued to support mobility and physical activity with small group balloon tennis and the fantastic weekly addition of Rubicon Dance delivering an online Zoom session enjoyed by men and women across the wards.

The virtual sessions from partner organisations Welsh National Opera, Harmoni Cymru and Forget-me-Not Chorus were initiated and supported by the Arts programme, part of Cardiff & Vale Health Charity.

The connecting of families with their loved ones has been a priority, arranging and facilitating Zoom calls and providing the opportunity to celebrate significant dates and anniversaries or simply tell one another how much they are loved.


"We worked with young people from Cardiff Youth Council and CAVHYB who shared their feedback on what they thought the areas should look like and designed the areas to meet those needs.

"The previous furnishings did not provide service users and their families with a relaxed, comfortable, safe environment which is important for the type of care required.

"The overall experience with our service is a really important part of the recovery journey and if service users do not feel comfortable in their environment, they may not feel comfortable to truly open up about the issues they are experiencing.

"The new furniture, painted walls and potted plants now provide a relaxed, modern theme that is more appealing and relevant to the age of services users which has been expressed in the amazing feedback received. Staff are also delighted with their new and improved clinic rooms. We would like to thank the Health Charity and all those who have supported and helped us achieve this amazing transformation." The improvements are ongoing with a new water station being installed in January, and the team are still awaiting Info screens, TVs and Ipads.









The 20th November marked Transgender Day of Remembrance, an annual memorial dedicated to the individuals who lost their lives due to transphobia. The aim of this day of memorial is to draw attention to the abuse and violence that is still carried out towards many people who are transgender today.

Cardiff & Vale Health Charity and Arts wanted to help make the newly established Wales Gender Service at St David's Hospital, feel like a welcoming safe space for its users whilst addressing issues of stigma and discrimination.

Working with the clinical team and members of the transgender community, a number of artists were commissioned to create a range of art, which includes paintings by artist Clare Williams, a sculpture for the unit's garden by Gideon Petersen and an illustrated mural by Miles Brayford.

Bike Health Checks – working with local charity Cardiff Pedal Power, and funded by Cardiff & Vale Health Charity, we will be offering Bike Health Check sessions at St. David's Hospital and some of our other hospital sites in the near future.

In the first instance, this will be a four hour morning or afternoon session on site to provide half hour slots to carry out safety checks on bikes and carry out minor repairs on site. The team would have a mobile stand and tools with them and will have Covid precautions in place.

If they find your bike needs a larger repair the team can then advise you on what's needed and you will have the opportunity to book your bike in with either Cardiff Pedal Power at their Pontcanna site or if you happen to use a local bike shop you can be armed with the information on what repairs are needed. We will keep you updated on the progress of this scheme, and would urge anyone with a bike to take this opportunity to make sure you have a 'healthy' bike!
