







There's more to Barry....Cardiff & Vale Health Charity's Arts for Health and Wellbeing Team were delighted to commission artist Haf Weighton to work with pupils at local school Ysgol Bro Morgannwg on an art project entitled 'There's more to Barry' which explored the rich history of Barry Town.

Partners for the project included the Vale of Glamorgan Council, Menter Bro Morgannwg - an organisation engaged in developing Welsh language opportunities in the Vale, and the Royston Smith Herbarium through National Museum Wales.

Sessions with GCSE pupils from the school began pre-lockdown in February 2020, and consisted of a number of interlocking themes focussing on Barry's history and also Barry as a centre for wellbeing.





Pupils designed postcards related to Barry's Seaside as a popular holiday destination, its old buildings within the town centre, and also Barry Docks. Pupils also created concertina sketchbooks and original artworks related to the Royston Smith Herbarium; a fascinating resident of Barry, Royston Smith discovered unusual flora in Barry Docks, which had been transported to Wales via shipping lanes from far-flung places, and collected, researched and documented the flora's medicinal properties.

The artwork created by pupils in collaboration with Haf Weighton is proudly displayed on the walls of the main corridor at Barry Hospital.

Update on current services - Barry Minor Injuries Department - The Standard Operational procedure (SOP) for Barry Minor Injuries Unit (BMIU), states that at this time staff cannot review patients for problems with their hips, back and chests, but this may change in the near future.

All BMIU appointments are to be made Via CAV 24/7 - Tel: 03001020247 where the patient will be directed to the appropriate service (GP, Dentist, Pharmacy, Physio). There is scope to see two Emergency patients per hour, the appointments will be made on assessment of need.

BMIU are trailing three Nurse Practitioners and a Physio Practitioner and they are hoping to expand the service of CAV 24/7. At this time, the operating hours are from 0830-1630.

Children's Phlebotomy - Following support from the Health Charity as part of the First Impressions project, the Children's Phlebotomy area opened at Barry Hospital in August 2019. The service was suspended due to Covid in March 2020 and hasn't resumed yet due to on-going staffing pressures and the restrictions.

However, we have been advised that the room, including the wall mural, was a great hit with the paediatric patients and their parents/guardians.

In the meantime, adult phlebotomy at Barry Hospital has moved to an appointment-only service with a total of 630 appointment slots from a Monday-Friday, with each day being fully booked. Work will commence this month to enable this service to move to the new area just off the waiting room, linked to the refurbished paediatric bleeding room.



Water Station - Nearly 5000 refills have now been recorded on the bottle filling water station at Barry Hospital. Keep re-usable bottles handy and keep hydrated! Dr Suzanne Wood, Consultant in Public Health Medicine said:

"Promoting healthy hydration is a key priority of our partnership plan to support people across Cardiff and the Vale to move more and eat well. Staying hydrated is important to keep our bodies healthy and water is a great choice for hydration as its free, calorie free and kind to your teeth."

Bike Health Checks – Working with local charity Cardiff Pedal Power, and funded by Cardiff & Vale Health Charity, we will be offering Bike Health Check sessions at Barry Hospital and some of our other hospital sites in the near future.

In the first instance, this will be a four hour morning or afternoon session on site to provide ½ hour slots to carry out a safety check on your bikes and carry out some minor repairs on site.

The team would have a mobile stand and tools with them and will have COVID precautions in place.

If it's a bigger repair the team can then advise on what's needed and you will have the opportunity to book your bikes in with either Cardiff Pedal Power at their Pontcanna site or if you happen to use a local bike shop you can be armed with the information on what repairs are needed.

We will keep you updated on the progress of this scheme, and would urge anyone with bikes to take this opportunity to make sure you have a 'healthy' bike!
