







Relocation of the Adult Phlebotomy Room, Barry Hospital – In September 2020 colleagues from the Phlebotomy Team submitted a Staff Lottery application for funds to relocate the phlebotomy bleeding room at Barry Hospital. During 2019, the phlebotomy department at Barry Hospital bled 43,204 patients and serves all the GP Surgeries in Barry along with additional patients through the outpatient service.

The original facilities had two bleeding chairs and was a short walk away from the main phlebotomy waiting room. With new Covid restrictions in place, this area was no longer suitable to accommodate two phlebotomists at a time. Prior to Covid, demand was already stretched and the requirement for a third phlebotomist had already been identified.

Funding from the Staff Lottery allowed the service to be relocated to a much more suitable area, located next to the new Paediatric Phlebotomy Room, and right next to the waiting room. This new area can house three chairs, allowing all three phlebotomists to see patients and reducing the waiting time for patient appointments. The room will also be Covid safe by having screens up between bleeding work stations, and increasing capacity to 930 appointments per week (currently 565 with Covid restrictions in place).

As an extra addition to this new area, Cardiff & Vale Health Charity contributed money for the 25th Anniversary Celebration Fund to commission a wall mural in this newly refurbished area. As there is no window in the new room, staff suggested an image of an open window looking onto a peaceful, bright and colourful view. Following the success of Rose McDonald's wall mural in the Paediatric Phlebotomy area (located just next door) created in June 2019, the team at Cardiff & Vale Health Charity knew just who to contact for another piece of art for the new Adult Phlebotomy Area.

After discussion with Rose and the team it was decided she would focus on a local landmark, the Viaduct at Porthkerry Park in Barry. Rose said: "To celebrate Barry Hospital's 25th anniversary, I created a large-scale window mural of Porthkerry Park, Barry. The adult phlebotomy room has no windows, so this colourful landscape will make a huge difference to the room for both the staff, and patients. I thoroughly enjoyed working on this mural and feel honoured to create such a memorable piece of artwork for the hospital. I would like to thank the Cardiff & Vale Health Charity for funding this fantastic project."



Pelvic Health Service - The Pelvic Health Community Hub is due to open in the Outpatient Department at Barry Hospital in Spring 2021. The aim of the Hub is to deliver patient- focused support, advice and treatment options for the management of pelvic floor disorders.

The central objective of the service is to provide a multidisciplinary approach towards patient care consisting of consultant colorectal surgeons, urogynaecologists, physiotherapists, dieticians, clinical nurse specialists, continence advisors and a pain management team.

The intent is to reduce waiting times and improve pelvic health services within the Cardiff and Vale of Glamorgan locality.
