The typical average adult needs between 1.5 to 2 litres of fluid a day and drinking enough is vital for good health. Across Cardiff and Vale University Health Board, Refill Stations have been installed for use by patients, staff and visitors to increase access to free drinking water and to cut down on plastic waste, Cardiff & Vale Health Charity have been pioneering the installation to promote healthy hydration and reduce waste.
