Every penny will support projects to help patients who have suffered an acquired brain injury at UHL. Projects include, eye-driven tablet communication technology, music therapy sessions and talking hearts, for families to record reassuring voice messages for their loved ones to listen to whilst in hospital.

We could not make these events so successful without the ongoing support of those in attendance and the wonderful donations from local businesses across Cardiff and the Vale.









Transformation of Inpatient Garden for Occupational Therapy MHSOP

Funding was recently approved from the Staff Lottery Bids Panel to provide equipment to transform an inpatient garden at UHL for use by Occupational Therapy inpatients within MHSOP.



Jane Finch who works in the Occupational Therapy department says, "This project will meet the needs of our patients by promoting independence, establishing meaningful activities and developing daily routines, with the aim of improving mental health and wellbeing."

Incorporating sensory stimulation and exercise programmes such as Tai Chi, Jabadao, and other game related activities including skittles, will improve quality of life, help to maintain strength and balance, reduce stress, agitation and behaviours that can be challenging for patients with a diagnosis of dementia and those in the later stages of the disease.

The addition of a dining area and outdoor furniture will allow patients to relax, enjoy the environment, socialise, and engage in arts and crafts.
