Meet the staff member – Natalie McCulloch

Natalie McCulloch (Nat) has three diverse roles and each one gives Nat a sense of fulfilment, pride and keeps her on her toes! Nat explains a little bit about her roles and why she loves working for Cardiff and Vale University Health Board.

"I am a Bank Health Care Support Worker (HCSW) and this is something which I NEVER thought I would do, but when the pandemic changed my role from an activities co-ordinator to HCSW, I was terrified, apprehensive and worried that I didn't have the skills, the stamina or the stomach to do this. I must say, I was



placed on Stroke Rehab Centre (SRC) and I adored it from the word go. I loved it so much I joined the bank and later got a full-time job in SRC too! I love the diversity of the role and it enables me to explore different wards throughout the UHB, meet new people, learn and gain new skills. I love the opportunity to be with patients at their worst and best times and help provide the care they need and deserve.

"I am also fortunate to work as a Patient Experience Support Worker. The Patient Experience team is fantastic and helps to provide those essential extras to patients such as phone calls, video calls, toiletries, activities and befriending. It's a very rewarding role; I listen, chat and interact with patients in ways that sadly other professionals may not have the same time-luxury to do so. I look forward to every shift I do.





"My dream job, and full-time role is as a Multi Professional Rehab Assistant (MPRA) on SRC. I work with an incredible team of colleagues, Multi-Disciplinary Team and of course the patients. I am fortunate enough to support those who've had a stroke to reach their rehabilitation goals whether it be speech and language, physiotherapy, occupational therapy based, or nursing, psychology, and dietetic based. It's a true honour to be part of their journey and every day is diverse.

"We operate a 7-day service to ensure that patients have rehab outside of usual therapy hours. We work until 6.30pm and cover 365 days of the year.

"I started in the NHS as a volunteer almost 20 years ago and every role I've had has given me joy, an opportunity to learn new skills, challenges, and incredible friends which makes me love the NHS. I couldn't be prouder to work for Cardiff and Vale University Health Board, and I hope to continue working in the NHS for years to come!

Our Health Meadow at University Hospital Llandough has received a Building with Nature Full Award, the first of its kind in Wales!

The Building with Nature Standards provide planners and developers with evidence-based, how-to, guidance on delivering high quality green infrastructure. The Standard puts nature at the heart of development



in a way that's good for people and for wildlife.

Our Health Meadow does exactly that. Our aim is to establish an ecological community health park which aims to benefit wildlife, plants and people through positive human environment interaction.





On Friday 17th June, CEO of Cardiff and Vale University Health Board, Suzanne Rankin, Head of Cardiff & Vale Health Charity and Arts Programme, Simone Joslyn, Minister for the Economy of Wales, Vaughan Gething MS, and our Down to Earth partners met in Our Health Meadow to announce the success of receiving the award.

Vaughan Gething MS said, "I'm really interested in seeing what we can create together here and the benefit it will provide for both patients, staff and the wider community. To develop something together with nature to have not just a net biodiversity gain but provide even more evidence for how outdoor health care can help you, me and everybody else who need our NHS."

Cardiff & Vale UHB CEO, Suzanne Rankin said, "Our Health Meadow is an absolutely inspirational project which is creating a new kind of space for health care delivery. It will create the opportunity for us to explore, and develop an understanding of the evidence base around this kind of healthcare, and create a space where our local community can get down to nature and experience this wonderful landscape."
