The Hearth Gallery – 'Affinity: A Celebration of Connection'

We are delighted to welcome the 'Affinity: A Celebration of Connection' Exhibition to the Hearth Gallery, featuring artwork made by the Creative and Therapeutic Arts (CTA) students at University of South Wales, as part of their 2nd year module. This is a collaborative project with Mental Health Services for Older People (MHSOP) at University Hospital Llandough.

Earlier this year, CTA students visited the MHSOP wards to deliver art workshops to people living with dementia. Four groups each decorated a large box and filled it with materials and instructions to create pieces of art with the general theme of celebration, as the NHS will be turning 75 this year.

The 'Affinity: A Celebration of Connection' exhibition will run until 19th June 2023.













Plaza – 'Celebrating Cardiff and Vale University Health Board' As part of the celebrations of the NHS turning 75 this year, the Arts for Health and Wellbeing Programme, with funding from Cardiff & Vale Health Charity's Staff Lottery, commissioned drawings of the 5 biggest sites of Cardiff and Vale University Health Board.

The two main commissions of University Hospital Llandough and University Hospital Wales were created by artist and Illustration lecturer at University of Wales Trinity St David, Swansea College of Art, Jonathan Williams. Drawn on site and from life, the pieces capture the busy and bustling environments often seen around the two sites, as well as the hospitals' recognisable architectural features.

The three smaller pieces were made by students of the BA (Hons) Illustration course at University of Wales Trinity St David, Swansea College of Art. The students have captured Barry Hospital, St David's Hospital and Cardiff Royal Infirmary in their own personal drawing styles, and a variety of mediums.





All five pieces will be exhibited at the University Hospital Llandough Plaza exhibition space until 12th June, and then gifted to the respective sites as a token of appreciation of the NHS and the staff within Cardiff and Vale University Health Board. We thank you all for your hard work caring for people; keeping people well, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Staff Lottery Funded Projects at UHL

The Staff Lottery supports staff across Cardiff and Vale not only by creating new winners every month, it also enables colleagues to apply for funding from the Staff Lottery Bids Panel, which has awarded grants of over £1.5 million to support numerous projects across the UHB which benefit patients, colleagues and visitors.

Wellbeing Space for colleagues at the Cochrane Library

The Staff Lottery Bids Panel recently supported a project to improve the environment of the newly created wellbeing area for colleagues in the Cochrane Library at University Hospital Llandough. Cardiff University have funded furniture, leisure reading, wellbeing books, information and





games to be installed in the designated area, and Staff Lottery funding will provide bright and modern artwork and wall vinyls to adorn the walls of the library.

The library is already a safe and quiet space for Cardiff and Vale University Health Board colleagues, where they can use computers to catch up with training, or study away from the busy hospital environment. The décor was previously dated and uninviting, with no designated relaxation space for the library users. By transforming the space with bright and modern artwork, the dedicated wellbeing area will welcome NHS staff to relax, decompress and find information on a range of mental health and wellbeing support. It can also be used to host wellbeing-related activities such as book clubs and mindfulness workshops.

Jennie Roe from the Libraries and Knowledge Service, said: "All Cardiff and Vale University Health Board staff are welcome to come in, have a look and find out how the library service can support you — we're based in the Routledge Building at the main entrance. Our Health Meadow Update

As the weather has warmed, so has work on Our Health Meadow. Since February, we have been working with patients, NHS colleagues and community members to create some beautiful features on the meadow and in the woodland. If you visit Our Health Meadow in this summer weather, you will notice two beautiful, sustainably constructed roundhouses. Funded through the generosity of Hubbub, every part of this build has been done with patients, colleagues and community members, from the foundations to the green roof.



Over the next few weeks cob seating and timber seating will be installed under the roundhouse to give everyone shelter from inclement weather and shade from the sun. These seating areas have been designed by participants of the programmes and offer a wonderful place to enjoy being in nature and take in the view.

Why not come and explore the three new sculptures which have appeared on the meadow as part of the Arts and Wellbeing Sculpture Trail.

Also planned for the upcoming few weeks:

• Installation of an accessibility path across the meadow and steps to the woodland entrance of Our Health Meadow; funding from Welsh Government Heritage Woodland Fund.





- Creation of a pond system and wetland area along the middle of the meadow to attenuate surface water on the meadow and create an additional habitat to enhance biodiversity; funding from Vale of Glamorgan Local Nature Partnershi
- Completion of the edible planters produced through the GROW courses with NHS colleagues and volunteers





May saw the conclusion of our final subsidized spaces on the Well-being in Nature Practitioner course. 30 spaces were funded to enable NHS colleagues to participate in 7/8 weeks of training, recognising the skills and experience required for practitioners offering nature-based activities for health and wellbeing. These courses have been a wonderful success with wonderful feedback from participants.

Finally, June 15th will see Our Health Meadow being celebrated with an outdoor, immersive conference: This is Fit For the Future: People, Nature, Impact. Over the course of this project, DTE has worked with over 1770





patients, NHS colleagues and community members to improve health and wellbeing through outdoor healthcare. This event will play host to the dissemination of the clinical research findings during the project, presentations and testimonials from a wide variety of NHS clinicians, talks about Building with Nature accreditation and Heritage Woodland Fund Coed Ysbyty Evaluation.


